Coronavirus update - school will not close during this new lockdown

As you are aware, the numbers of cases of Coronavirus are increasing nationally with the government moving to a national lockdown to reduce transmission. We are learning more about the virus and we are working hard to prevent its spread whilst keeping children in school.

Coronavirus has three main symptoms; these are; a cough, loss or change in sense of smell or taste, or a high temperature. When anyone displays one of these symptoms it could be a Coronavirus infection and we therefore ask you to isolate with your household. Anyone with symptoms should book a test, and if positive, self-isolate for 14 days. Please make sure you let school know the outcome of the test. New helpline to support Black, Asian and minority ethnic children, young people and their families impacted by Covid-19.

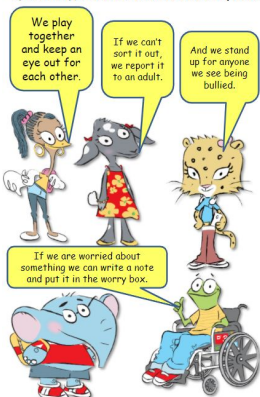

Anti-bullying / Safety week

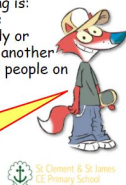
