### **Black History Month**

At St Clement & St James and St Thomas' we stand united in our commitment to tackle and challenge racism, address inequality and call out discrimination. Diversifying and decolonising the curriculum is a long term commitment for us.

As many of you know we have already taken some steps to address diversity in our school and we'd like to thank parents who attended our recent Google meeting for their contributions. We all agree that it is important that the contributions and perspectives of all heritages are recognised, learned about and celebrated as part of a fully inclusive curriculum and as a result, we will not be marking Black History Month as such. Instead, we are changing our whole year-long curriculum so that significant people from diverse backgrounds and global histories will be studied as part of everyday learning. We have been asked by the local authority to lead a working party to address racial equality in the curriculum, with about 20 other primary and secondary schools in both RBKC and Westminster, involved in this piece of work. We will seek further parental views in the coming weeks but in the meantime, please contact the school if you'd like to be more involved in the development of our curriculum.
