# Dear parents and carers,

We hope you have had a lovely week and your children are settling in to their new classes.

# Arriving in the morning

The staff team has been observing how our lovely children are getting on at the start of each day and we have been very impressed with how well they have adjusted to our new approach. We are allowing children to arrive at 8:45 and gradually walk up to class in order avoid lining up. Research has shown that this approach has a positive impact on children's 'readiness for learning' and we have noticed that they are calm and keen to engage in morning activities. Teachers are able to welcome each child individually and always ensure that a learning activity is prepared for them before the register is taken. Children who choose a bagel in the morning are allowed to eat them in class before they start the morning task. All support staff are stationed in designated areas around the school building so that your child is both welcomed and carefully supervised. As I am sure you will understand, we have to prioritise the children's education at the start of each day so that we have a smooth transition from home to school.

If you need to speak with your child's class teacher, they will be available in the playground at the end of each day. You can also ring the school from 8:00am to 8:30am and either leave a message or speak directly to your child's teacher. In addition to this, we are on the gate every morning and are also happy to pass on any important messages and answer any queries or questions that you may have. For children in the Early Years Centre, we ask that parents stay and support their child to settle into class for the first 10 minutes of each day. Many parents have reported that they are pleased with the soft start while a small number have expressed concerns. We hope this message has reassured you but we are happy to discuss any further concerns with you.

We are very grateful for your support and hope you appreciate your child's education and well-being is our absolute priority. We are doing everything we can to create a purposeful learning environment.
