All scores will be converted to a standardised score to determine whether you are 'Working Towards', 'Working At' or 'Working Above' the Year 6 Standard.


<u>Results</u>

Starting in the room of your choice, ask a member of your household to time how long it takes to find the objects below. You can find the items in any order. Submit your time and if possible a photograph of the objects found. Add a 10 second penalty for any objects not found.

FIND THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS:

• An item of clothing that is the colour you would get if you mixed blue and yellow together

- An item of clothing that has at least 4 buttons on
- A pen, pencil or crayon that is the top colour of a rainbow
- The word 'SCHOOL' look in a book, magazine or newspaper
- Your school jumper
- A dessert spoon
- A book you have read
- A school photograph of yourself
- Something that will hold everything you've found


Solve the maths problems
