

Olivia's Lockdown Journal so far.



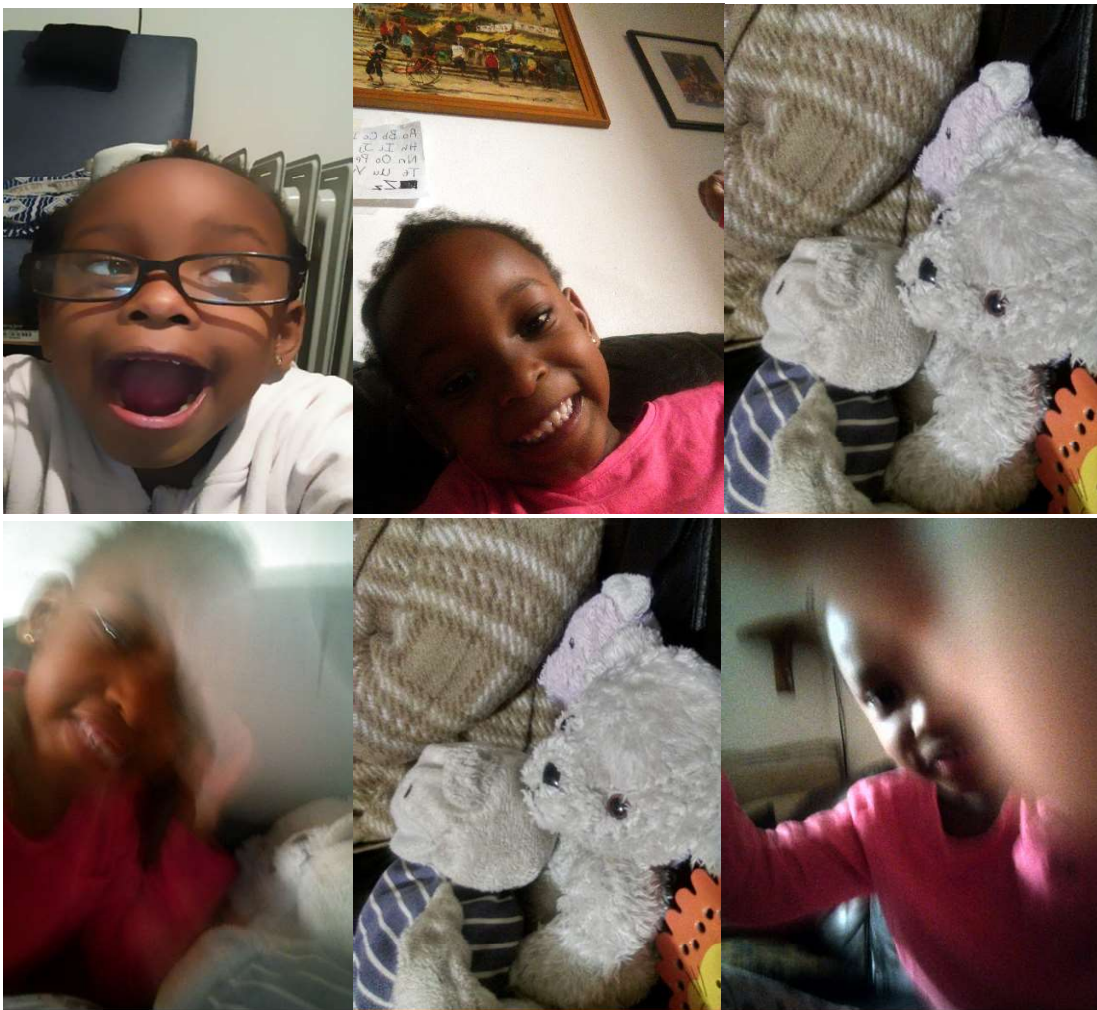
March – May 2020

Mummy let me wear costumes for breakfast, I am eating one of my favourites,

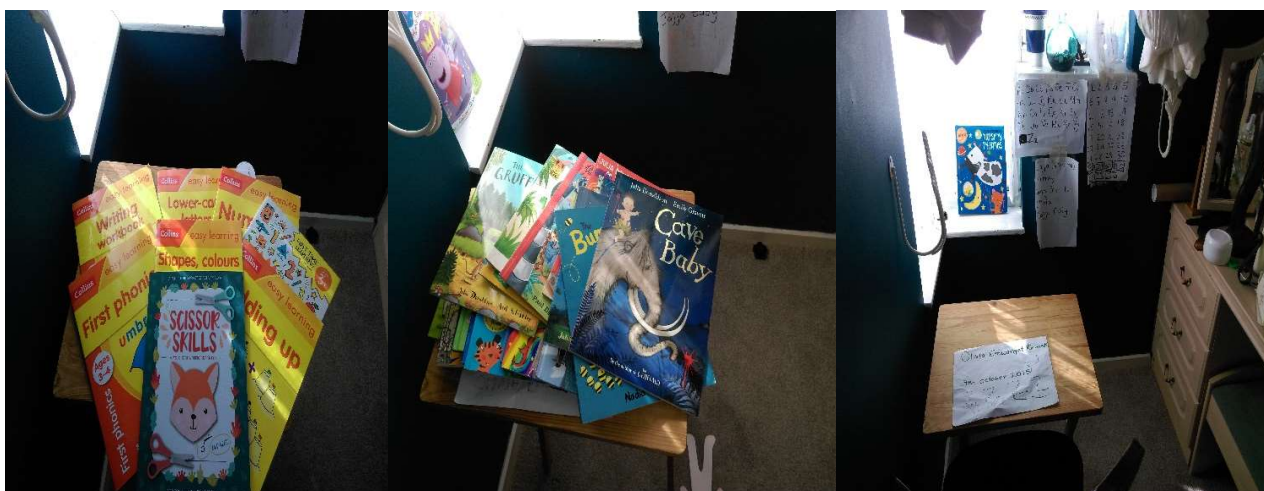
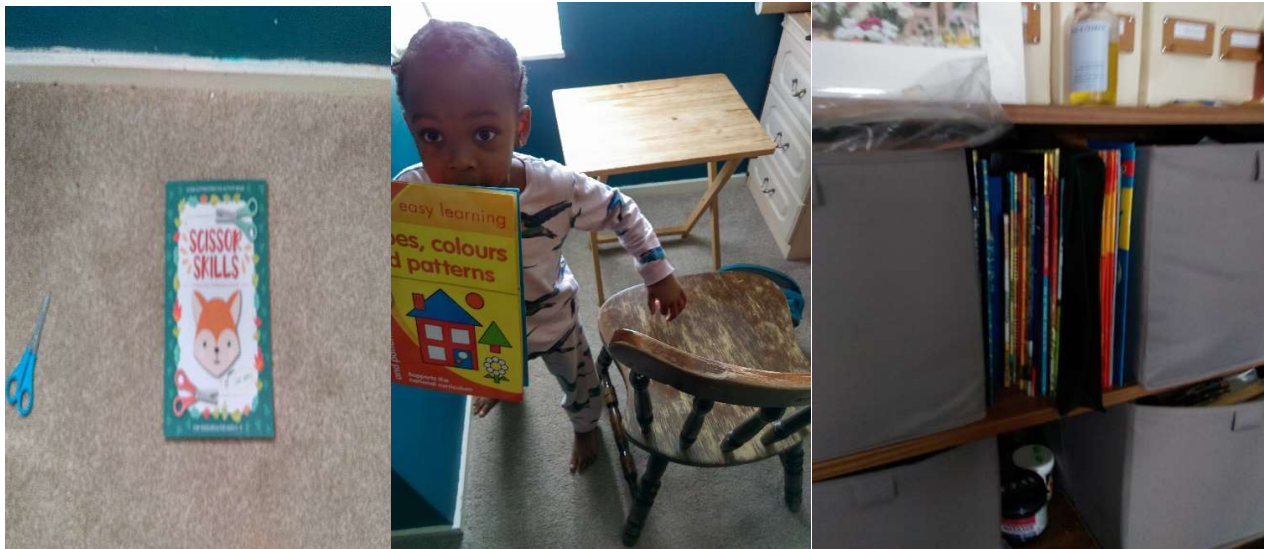
"Bread, Jam and Butter". (American accent, like Ryan on YouTube)

Mummy let me help in the kitchen and I helped when she was cooking Lasagna.



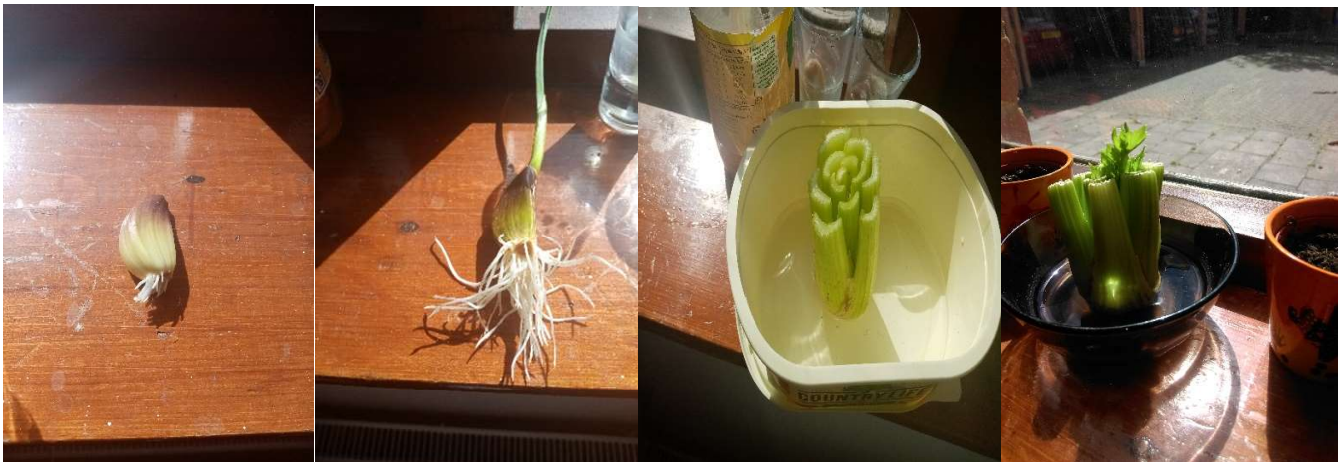
Mummy created a study area for me, with a table and chair facing the window. I call it pretend school.

Mummy placed my study and reading books on the bookcase like a library, sometimes Mummy let me pick the books she was going to read to me.

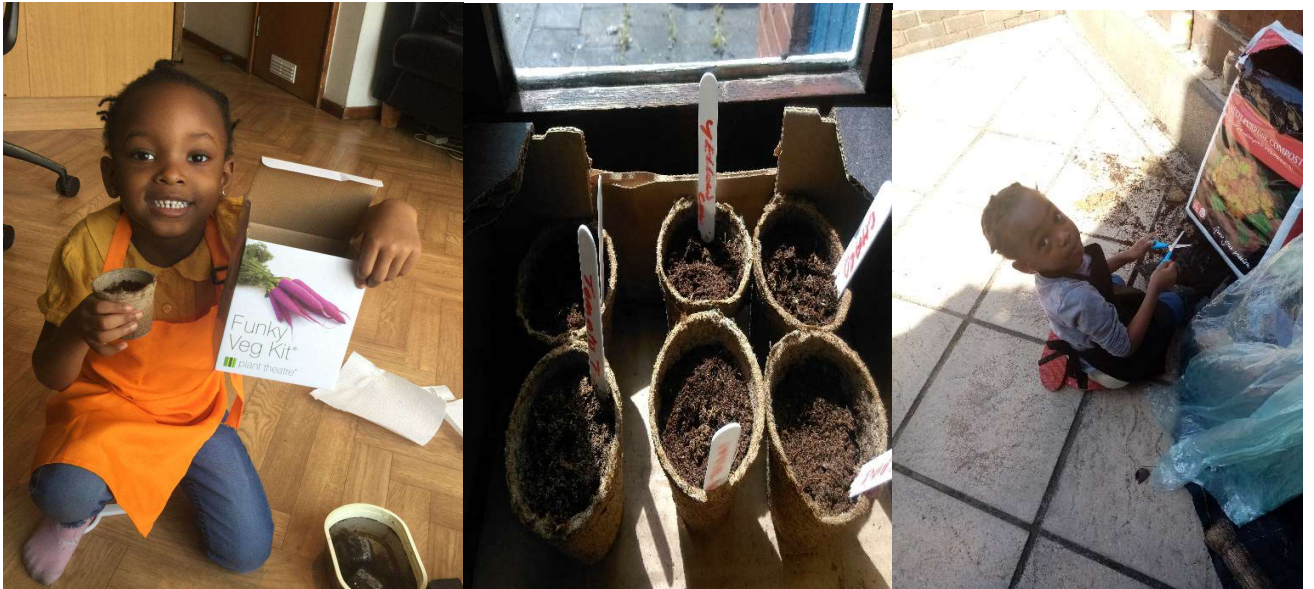
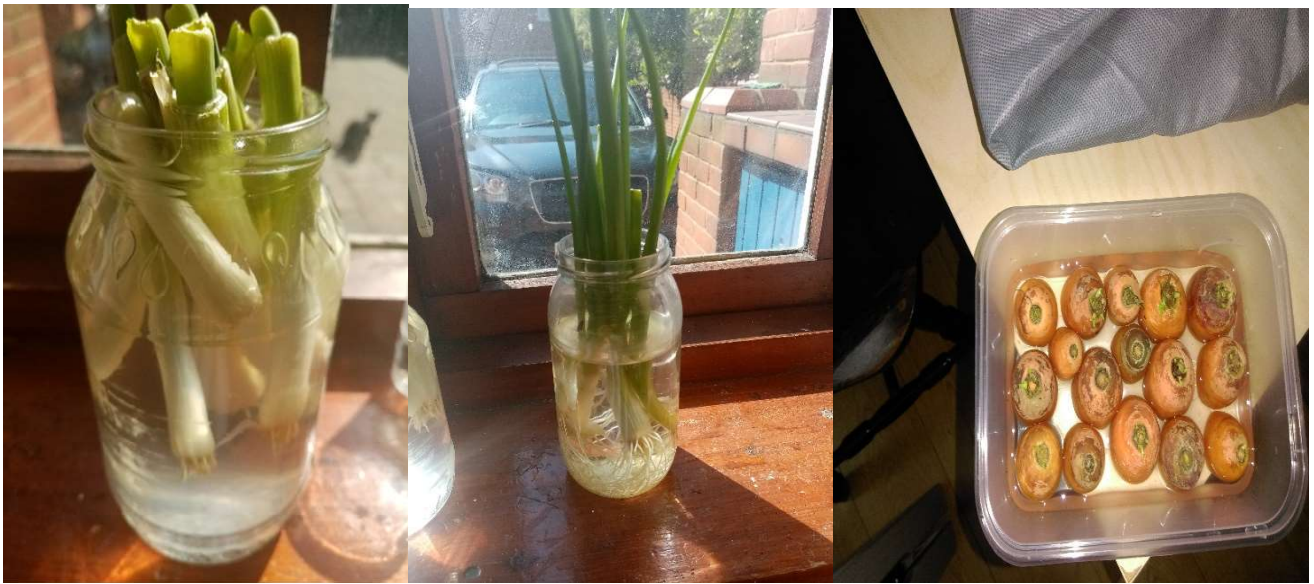


I preferred playing and I am only allowed my Tablet on weekends.
